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PRIMARY TRAINER ENDORSEMENT

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

As the trainer, you play an important role as a gatekeeper for the field of psychodrama, sociometry and group psychotherapy, helping to ensure that those certified are qualified as competent and ethical practitioners. You may endorse an applicant provided you have personally observed the applicant directing psychodrama or sociodrama sessions that reveal the knowledge, skills and abilities relevant to the practice of psychodrama, sociometry and group psychotherapy on at least three separate occasions.

Provide your endorsement narrative on letterhead in a Word or PDF file. Be sure to respond to each of the items below.

Although the majority of your comments should focus on the applicant's performance in the director role, you may also make brief mention of other roles, such as auxiliary, group member, protagonist, and service to the psychodrama community.

Dates of Observation: Please describe the frequency and format of the supervision plan you have agreed to this year. (Please note: supervision sessions must be at least 50 minutes and group supervision size must not exceed 4 participants).

Relationship Context: What areas have you agreed to cover in this year's supervision sessions?

Please describe the training plan you have agreed to for the upcoming year? Please note a minimum of 20 hours of training is required yearly.

Please describe the Continuing Education plan you have recommended for your supervisee this year? (Include topics and providers).

RECOMMENDATION: MUST include the primary trainer's signature and the following two (2) statements:

I have carefully read and reviewed the applicant's *SP Application Form* and supporting documents. I recommend and endorse the applicant without reservation for certification as a Supervised Practitioner (SP) of Psychodrama, Sociometry and Group Psychotherapy.
